Driving and using machines

Do not drive while taking this medicine until you know how it affects you. It is an **offence** to drive if this medicine affects your

3. How to take Solpadeine Max Tablets

Swallow 2 tablets every 4-6 hours as needed. Do not take more frequently than every 4 hours.

Children aged 16 – 18 years: Swallow 1-2 tablets every 6 hours as needed. Do not take more frequently than every 6 hours.

Do not take more than 8 tablets in 24 hours.

Do not take more than 8 tablets in 24 hours.

Children aged 12 – 15 years:

Swallow 1 tablet every 6 hours as needed. Do not take more frequently than every 6 hours. Do not take more than 4 tablets in 24 hours.

Do not take more than the recommended dose. Solpadeine Max Tablets should not be taken by children below the age of 12 years, due to the risk of severe breathing problems.

This medicine should not be taken for more than 3

days. If the pain does not improve after 3 days, talk to your doctor for advice.

Possible withdrawal effects

This medicine contains codeine and can cause addiction if you take it continuously for more than 3 days. When you stop taking it you may get withdrawal symptoms. You should talk to your doctor or pharmacist if you think you are suffering from withdrawal symptoms.

Talk to a doctor at once if you take too much of this medicine, even if you feel well. This is because too much paracetamol can cause delayed, serious liver damage. If your symptoms continue or your headache becomes persistent, see your doctor

4. Possible side effects

Some people may have side effects when using this medicine. If you have any unwanted side effects you should seek advice from your doctor, pharmacist or other healthcare professional.

When using this product you may experience:

Stop taking this medicine and tell your doctor immediately if you experience:

 Severe abdominal pain, nausea and vomiting if you have recently had your gall bladder removed

Allergic reactions which may be severe such as skin rash and itching sometimes with swelling of the mouth or face or shortness of breath

Skin rash or serious skin reactions (very rare cases reported)

Breathing problems. These are more likely if you have experienced them before when taking other painkillers such as ibuprofen and aspirin

Unexplained bruising or bleeding

Nausea, sudden weight loss, loss of appetite and yellowing of the eyes and skin. Reporting of side effects: If you get any side effects,

talk to your doctor, pharmacist or nurse. This includes any possible side effects not listed in this leaflet. You can also report side effects directly via the Yellow Card Scheme at:

How do I know if I am addicted?

· When you stop taking the medicine you feel very unwell but you feel better if you start taking the medicine again






